The meeting was conducted by the convener and few points from the previous meeting were highlighted, the convener invites the member secretary to move on with the meeting. In this meeting HMIS report for the month of August and September, 2023 was analyzed and the following points are highlighted in the meeting as well as action points to be taken.

 Antenatal registration in 1st trimester: Total ANC registration for the month of August and September is 470. Out of this, registration within 1st trimester is only 59.36%.
 Amongst the 35 HWC and SCs Mautlang HWC have 0% achievement. And there are 8 HWC/SC who had a low performance below 50%, viz,.

15.38% Bungtlang S SC 25% 2. Champur P HWC 3. Saizawh W HWC 25% 4. Tuithumhnar HWC -32.50% 42.11% 5. M Kawnpui SC 47.57% 6. Ajasora HWC 7. Chawngte C HWC -45.83% 46.15% 8. Borapansury SC

It can be seen that, out of 9 facilities with low performance in the 1st trimester registration of pregnant women, 7 of them are HWC posted with HWO/MO Ayush, it seem that these facilities needs to try and improve regarding this indicator, and Supportive supervision and monitoring is badly needed.

 IFA 180 tablet distribution:- out of the total ANC registration only 47.87% received IFA 180 tablets during August and September, 2023.

Out of 35 facilities Saizawh W HWC have 0% achievement, and there are 6 facilities with a very low performance regarding this indicator, viz,.

1. Hmunlai HWC - 25%
2. Tuithumhnar HWC - 40%
3. Sangau SC - 36.84%
4. Ajasora HWC - 31.58%
5. Chamdur P HWC - 25%
6. Vaseitlang HWC - 15.38%

3. Complete/4ANC : the district achievement for this is 47.87% which is very low as most of the Scs are upgraded to HWC posted with HWO/MO Ayush.

There are 5 facilities with 0% achievement regarding this indicator, namely,

- 2. Mautlang HWC
- 3. Borapansury SC
- 4. Saizawh HWC
- 5. Sumsilui HWC

And another 8 facilities with a very low performance regarding this indicator,

4. Deliveries: The total Home delivery is 32.69% and the institutional delivery is 67.31%. In this we have found a slight improvement in diminishing the home deliveries and increasing institutional delivery.

Even though Parva HWC is equipped to conduct institutional deliveries, with delivery room being newly constructed, they have not conducted delivery so for, this may be due to the fact that there are no Female Health Worker posted in this facility, even though the Male Health worker is trained SBA, the local people does not believe in the male worker regarding conducting delivery.

- Home Based Newborn Care (HBNC): The total HBNC achievement is 45.33%. which is quite low, and, out of total home deliveries only 56.30% received HBNC and out of total institutional deliveries only 40% received HBNC, in this regard, the ASHA Coordinator is to be informed to mobilize the ASHAs.
- 6. Fully immunized below 1 year of age: the district achievement regarding this indicator for the month of August and September 2023, is 94.20% which is very good, and hope to remain the same for the coming months.

From the points mentioned above, of the six indicators selected, only one indicator, which is Fully immunized below one year is satisfactory, and the rest need to be improved. Out of 35 facilities 30 are upgraded to HWC, and of all the facilities, Saizawh W HWC, Ajasora HWC, Tuithumhnar HWC, Chamdur P HWC, Mautlang HWC are the low performing HWC and of the SC Sangau SC and Borapansury SC and Bungtlang SC are low performing Sc, so it is suggested that, the district need monitoring visit to the mentioned Health Facilities.

7. Grievance redressal: Regarding inadequacy of HMIS formats to be brought up at DHT meeting, the convener and member secretary will be the one responsible for this.
